ENVIRONMENT

We continue to actively explore the possibility of grants to facilitate the introduction of PV panels onto the roof of the Collingwood Road end stand and a site visit was planned for the end of this month to assess our suitability.

Pavilion

Work has already started, with the demolition of the toilets in the north-east corner of the stadium, and now the construction contract has been signed, to commence with digging a trench within our ground footprint to provide utilities for the building. The metal frame for the pavilion has already been put together and has been highly visible in our car-park for several months. It will, of course, have to be moved to the other side of the stadium before the external cladding can be applied.

We hope that once the pavilion has been opened it will prove to a valuable local asset, and we have already received a number of expressions of interest including from the NHS and police.

SOCIAL VALUE

We are delighted to have secured an agreement for use of the David Weir Centre for our women's First and Development teams for all of next season. This season has seen us reach the 3rd Round of the FA Cup for the first time and our Development Team is locked in a 3-way battle for the league title and promotion from the Surrey Premier Division of the South East Counties Women's Football League.

Cheam Park Farm School will represent our Foundation in both the girls' and boys' categories in the regional finals for Year 6 after winning our qualifying tournament. The Foundation's Harry Dunne has been attending at Forrester's School as part of their programme to encourage children to read, leading them in reading some specially created football-related content that greatly improves levels of engagement.

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
