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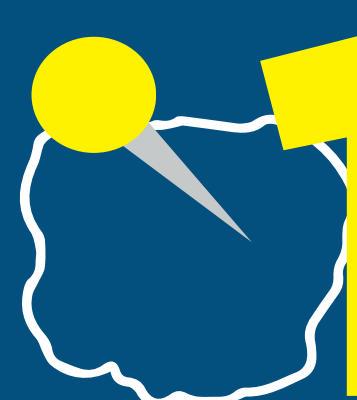
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TIM ALLISON CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER

It's lovely again to welcome National League football back to the Borough Sports Ground after around three months. Of course some will have attended one of the five pre-season fixtures here, but fun though they have been, this is "real".

Off the pitch there has been the usual behind the scenes work. There has been plenty of cleaning and painting, as well as some longer lasting changes. We have also invested again in the fanzone, mostly redeveloping the Club Shop, now partnered by VX3. But also reflooring toilets and making some changes in signage.

The more noticeable change happening – tomorrow as I write this and yesterday as you read it! – concerns the Sutton United Pavilion. On-site building works commenced just after New Year, but with that part of the ground closed,

being off camera, and with works mostly below ground level, little appeared to be happening other than a fenced off home to some construction equipment. The framework has sat waiting patiently in our car park for several months. If plans come to fruition as I hope, a new vista of our community vision will be there for supporters to see on the stadium footprint.

That project and its expected future use for the Club, Foundation and the wider community could be an entire programme's worth of material in its own right. In the meantime, I would just like to thank all that have been involved from its first mental inception to its current physical manifestation, and I look forward to the programme notes I will write at some point this season regarding its official opening.

Regarding the season itself we have already completed the first match of a 46-match marathon with the return to the EFL as our goal. Even were 3UP to be achieved that isn't an easy task. The Board and the manager know our budget, and with enough accuracy those of our main rivals. Last year was one of clear underperformance and disappointment. An early recognition of that and the subsequent change of management reset expectations around staying up as a priority. Now achieved, Aggy has his own team, has selected his own squad, and collectively we set the first easy target of "being better". That's not good enough in itself for me, and nor is it the vision sold to the players joining us through the summer's recruitment. I can assure you they wouldn't have got on board the project unless we were ambitious in asking for much more.

Targets and promises can always come back to haunt you, but Chris has already – semi-jokingly – referenced who would be hosting an October Meet-the-Manager event if things don't go as he wants them too.

I have already demanded in my own communications wanting the problems of a return to on-field success, and the off-field headaches that can bring. Significant increases in support on the back of winning more matches (especially at home). Bums-on-seats is already the rallying cry across the changing room as I'm constantly reminded (Charlie Carter especially!). But as many will also know the EFL will be treating us as a 3 year plus 1 day Football Club when we get promoted, and not as "newbies". We HAVE to be ready, not just for that first match in August whenever that year comes, but also to be convincing in our plans and execution capability to even be allowed to participate in the play-offs.

Without kicking a ball for the Club – an ambition long since recognised as being unachievable – I am working on the basis that finishing 7th is not just desirable but a credible possibility this year. That is my prediction and my "nice problem to have".

In that vein it was great to be standing with over 500 Sutton United supporters as part of that first incarnation of the season's Amber Army

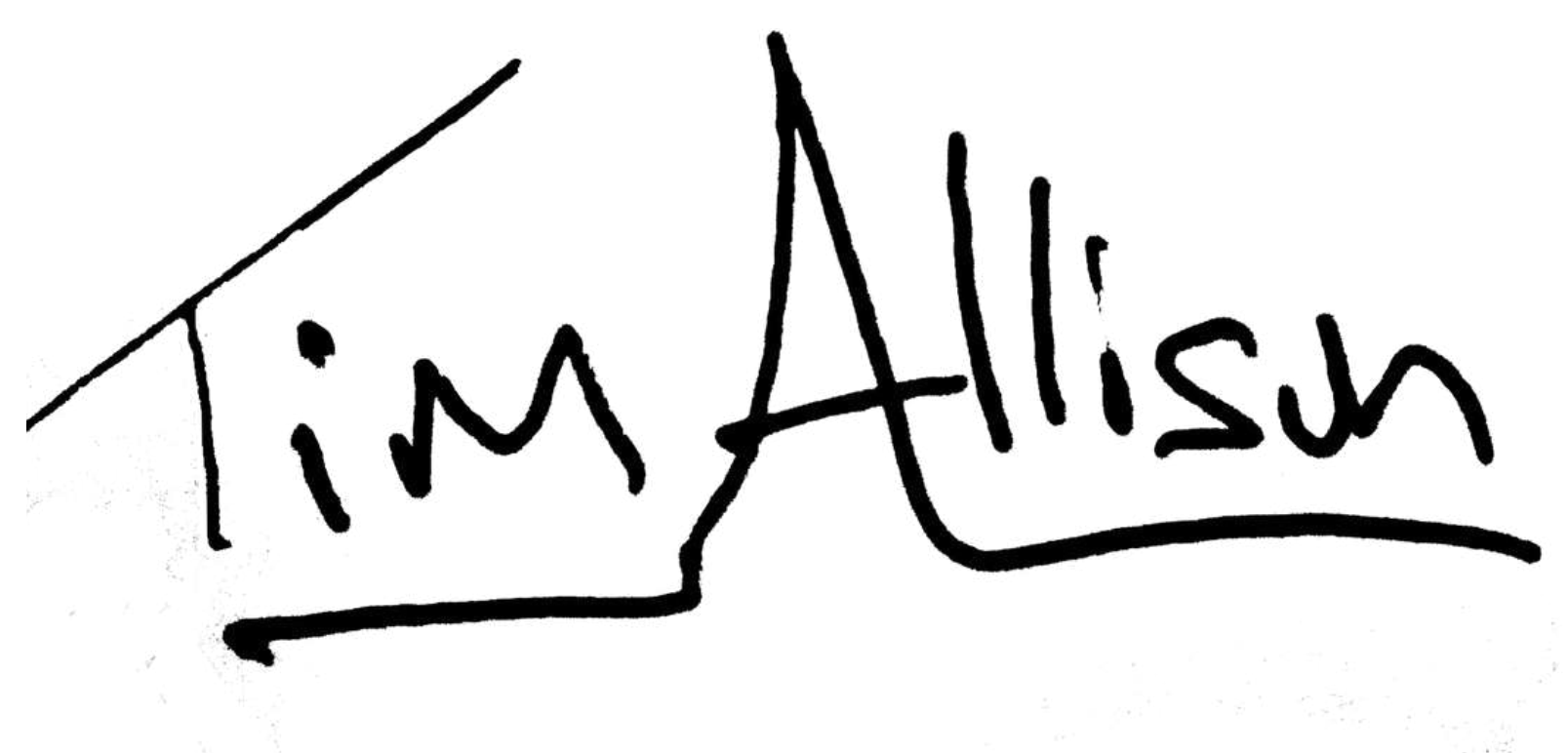
enjoying victory over local rivals last weekend. So much to enjoy. Charlie Bell as many people's Man of the Match selection returning to the scene of his league debut and first goal. Will Nighti(n)gale (ahem!) scoring on his competitive debut and making the National League Team of the Week. Aggy being reminded what a touchline looks like! But seriously. Three goals, a clean sheet, three points, third in the League (on alphabet behind Hornchurch!) , all at the only other team in Surrey competing at our level who topped us in the football pyramid last year for the first time in many years.

That can't be expected to happen every week of course, but for three years we have struggled to win, and in doing so mostly by the odd goal. Now I don't want to be the pessimist as I genuinely think it was both deserved but also a reflection on the improved team. But 2023/24 started with a 5-1 home victory on the opening game of the season. The rest of the year didn't go as well.

The last time we hosted today's visitors Altrincham as our first opponents in our own backyard it finished 5-0 in our favour. That season wasn't as bad but we still fell short of those play-off spots. So let's get behind the team as the 12th man today and drive them on to another three points. I'd like to think we'd go past at least one, if not both, of the teams ahead of us if we do.

I will use these pages in the coming weeks to add more on what is happening off the pitch and behind the scenes, and also be covering our other teams too as their respective seasons also start. But for today be magnificent in your support in the sunshine. Stay safe and look after one another.

Born in St Asaph, Wales, Gibson began his career in Tranmere Rovers' Academy, spending five years there before making appearances for the first team. He went on to play for several clubs including Rhyl, Sheffield Wednesday, Southport, Halesowen Town, Leigh RMI and Prestatyn.

At Prestatyn he enjoyed a long association, making over 100 appearances and spending thirteen years as manager. He later managed Flint Town United and Connah's Quay Nomads before joining Wealdstone midway through the 2024/25 season.

After guiding the Stones to safety he returned north to Altrincham, initially as interim manager before being appointed permanently in November.

10 **Aidan Barlow** Midfielder

26-year-old winger Aidan Barlow signed for Altrincham this summer after departing last season's National League play-off winners Rochdale.

Barlow started his career in Manchester United's academy, where he put up very impressive numbers. He also made appearances for England's youth teams, being capped at U17 and U18 level. In 2019 he spent four months out on loan at Norwegian side Tromsø IL, making seven appearances and scoring twice. Released by Manchester United, he spent nearly a year looking for clubs going on trials at clubs such as Stoke City and Ipswich Town. He finally found a new club at Doncaster Rovers where he spent two seasons before dropping down to the National League with Eastleigh. After a season with the Spitfires he joined Rochdale, and after featuring in their promotion last season he signed for Altrincham in the summer.





8 **Liam Humbles** Midfielder

Liam Humbles was born in Miami, USA, before moving to England to pursue a future in football. Spending his youth in the AFC Wimbledon set-up he moved to Salford City where he would gain his scholarship into the first team.

He would spend his three professional years at Salford mainly on loan at clubs such as Nantwich Town and Gateshead, as well as Altrincham, but he did make eleven appearances for the first team.

In 2025 he signed permanently for Rochdale, but made only one appearance in the single season he spent there as he was sent back on loan to Altrincham last campaign. Making 18 appearances and scoring three goals, he impressed to the point Altrincham decided to make the 22-year-old midfielder's move permanent this summer.





11 Jimmy Knowles Forward

Jimmy Knowles spent his younger years in the Nottingham Forest academy before moving to Mansfield Town at youth level.

In 2019 he scored four goals in a reserve game against Port Vale which earned him a two year professional contract with the club. However he would not get the chances he hoped for, spending three years out on loan at clubs like Notts County, Greenock Morton and Kettering Town, but still managing six appearances for Mansfield Town scoring once in those games.

In 2023 he moved permanently to Boston United, where he scored 18 times in 47 games, earning a move back into the EFL with Accrington Stanley, but after two goals in sixteen games he was sent back to Boston United on loan midway through the 2024-25 season.

In 2025 the 24-year-old signed permanently with Altrincham and enjoyed a good campaign last time out scoring eleven goals in 45 games.

HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

As this season will start on the back of a World Cup tournament involving Mexico as a host nation, I pop back to another where the same country was the sole host. England's defence of the Jules Rimet Trophy would be derailed by a number of controversies. Captain Bobby Moore and his alleged theft of some jewellery (he didn't) and Gordon Banks ill through food poisoning thus missing the quarter-final against West Germany. Conspiracy theories abound over the latter's ailment but I read somewhere he strayed off the official menu and ate a sandwich in a bar. Whatever, the reason England gave up a 2-0 lead to lose 3-2 in extra-time was Sir Alf's decision to protect Bobby Charlton and substitute him with twenty odd minutes left. Beckenbauer took over and England were out. And arguably the best national side ever assembled defeated Italy in the final at the Azteca by 4-1.

Manager Sid Cann's summer was ruined by the decision of Ted Powell and then Larry Pritchard to join Wycombe Wanderers. I asked Larry about that move some years ago and he said it was for better coaching. U's had also lost Micky Mellows as his studies took him to Winchester. Powell and Pritchard were the heartbeat of Sutton back then, two England internationals lost to an Isthmian rival.

Pre-season signings amounted to Alan Pentecost (Oxford City) and goalkeeper, Gary Bloom (Walton & Hersham). Robin Gonzales was given the Pritchard role with Pentecost wearing Powell's no 4 shirt. Neither was a patch on their illustrious predecessors.

Off the pitch the club considered buying what was then known as The Borough Sports Ground off Sutton Council. However, the current cost of the yearly lease, then £1,500 may suddenly rise by £2k as the club would need to meet the costs of maintenance, etc. As we know, it didn't happen.

Only two friendly fixtures were arranged and at either end of the attraction spectrum.

Wednesday 5th brought Chelsea's FA Cup winning

team to GGL for the Bud Flanagan Leukaemia Fund. Over 3,500 watched Barbara Windsor "kick-off", resplendent in tight white boots to just below the knee, and Chelsea run out 3-0 winners. The following Saturday, U's entertained '69/70 Midland Combination champions Paget Rangers. A small crowd saw Trevor Bladon net in each half in a 2-0 win. Mellows played in both matches but would make just one more appearance for the club, at Oxford City the Saturday before Christmas.

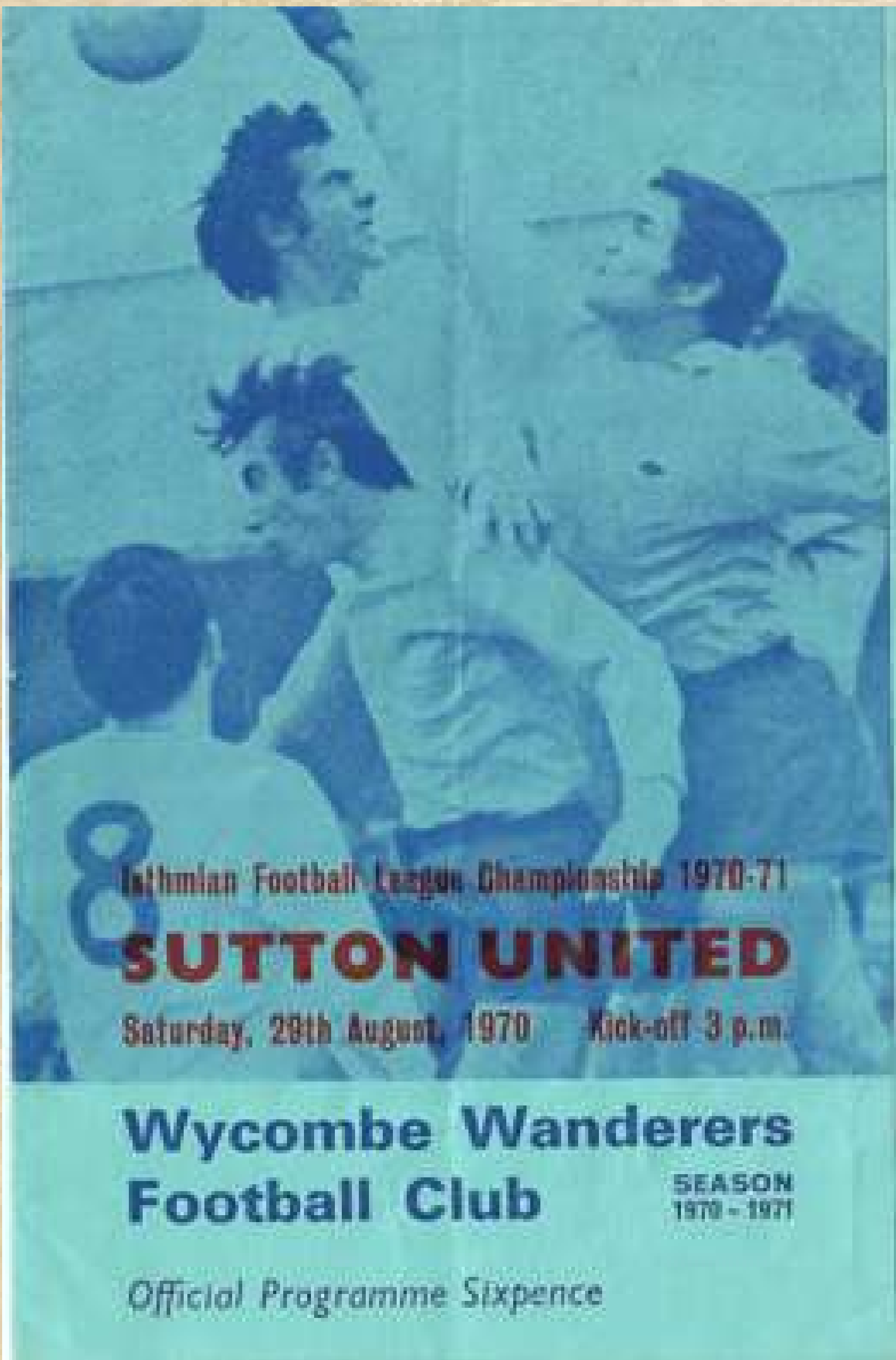
The Isthmian League season thus commenced on this day, fifty six years ago. U's travelled to Ilford's long gone Lynn Road ground. U's were under the cosh for much of the first half but fared better in the second after the hosts had failed to take their chances. Soon after the break, Peter Drabwell hooked in from a Trevor Waughman pass and Terry Howard slotted in following a Waughman long throw-in (63rd minute). A winning start post Powell and Pritchard. Both goal scorers would end the season as Ilford players. My main memory of that afternoon was the chap in his tiny back garden, rolled up shirt sleeves sitting in a deck chair reading his newspaper, oblivious to what was happening just twenty odd yards away; the Sutton Advertiser report suggested that he didn't miss much!

The following Tuesday, Leytonstone visited GGL for another IL match. Following a sunny Saturday, the first half was played in constant rain but that did not deter the hosts. Drabwell (9th) and Howard (37th) netted first half headers before Howard powered in another headed goal from Waughman's cross in the 65th minute. Five minutes later a long distance free-kick by Picking beat Bloom all ends up; 3-1 to U's.

The second Saturday of the season saw U's host Hitchin Town in another league encounter. Like Sutton, the visitors had started with two victories but it was U's who enjoyed the match's early portion and the Drabwell/Howard show continued with the latter setting up a headed

goal for the former (22nd). However, Hitchin scored a 37th minute goal through Grogan. The second half was much like the first with Sutton the attacking threat but the goals would not come; 1-1.

U's took a brief break from IL football to contest the delayed 1969/70 London Charity Cup Final. The match played on 25th August was against Kingstonian at their old Richmond Road ground. K's took an early lead but Howard scored in the 49th minute. K's again led but Bladon restored parity. Pentecost and Bladon with his second ensured that the LCC would at last nestle in the Sutton trophy cabinet, U's having lost the two previous finals, both to Dagenham.



Featured Match

29th August v Wycombe Wanderers at Loakes Park

Sutton ended the month with what would prove a chastening experience on Wycombe's infamous sloping pitch. As well as Powell and Pritchard, Wanderers also fielded former Sutton player Keith Blunt (all three would later manage SUFC). The hosts were just too strong for this Sutton side and Pritchard was in brilliant form, while U's 'keeper Bloom had a poor afternoon (sadly, it would not be his last).

In the 11th minute, Bloom palmed a Horseman corner into his own net and in the 27th minute, Pritchard burst through to curl a shot beyond the U's custodian. Delaney headed in from a free-kick in the 65th minute and four minutes later Bremer thumped home following another set-piece delivery, Bloom inexplicably diving away from the direction of the shot.

Only dogged defending prevented the defeat becoming an absolute humiliation but 4-0 it finished. I missed this match as my mother refused to go having had arguments with the locals on two previous visits, one of which was for an England amateur international. Solidarity. For the record I was 8 years old.

United ended the month with five points from four matches (two points for a win in those days), some five points adrift of leaders Wycombe who had played a game more and boasted a 100% record netting twenty goals. Of course, silverware had been won too. IL scorers for U's: Drabwell 3, Howard 2, Bladon 1.

U's would bounce back as Cann strengthened the side by signing Chris Kelly and Willie Smith from Tooting & Mitcham United in mid-September. Following a damaging home defeat to struggling Maidstone United,

he dropped Bloom in late September allowing Dave Roffey to return. From September to mid-November, U's won fifteen of seventeen IL matches propelling them into title contention. They would miss out by a point, Pritchard's goal winning the title decider at GGL in April 1971.

The NL’s perverse fixture list (don’t get me started on Gateshead away, they really don’t care about the travelling fan) brings Altrincham back to GGL having been our final opponents at home last season.

Alty claimed a third success at Sutton with a 2-1 victory as U’s end of season form rather collapsed to leave a finishing position of 19th.

Jermaine Francis’s first goal for U’s gave them a 20th minute lead but two Oliver Crankshaw goals (71st and 74th minutes) secured the points.

Therefore, Altrincham recorded their third league double over Sutton.

This is the Robins tenth visit to GGL, all contested at GMVC/NL level. Alty were successful on their first visit back in September 1986 by 3-2 and won here again in November 1990. Sutton have won five and drawn one of the other six, the rather mis-leading 5-0 success two seasons ago referred to above being the biggest margin of victory between the two clubs. U’s 4-0 win at

Moss Road in April 2021 is the biggest between the two clubs at that venue, Alty recording a 3-0 success in March 2000. Sutton’s only previous success in Cheshire was in November, 1987a by 1-0 (Micky Stephens), which together with a 2-1 win at GGL later in the season gave U’s their only league double in the fixture to date.

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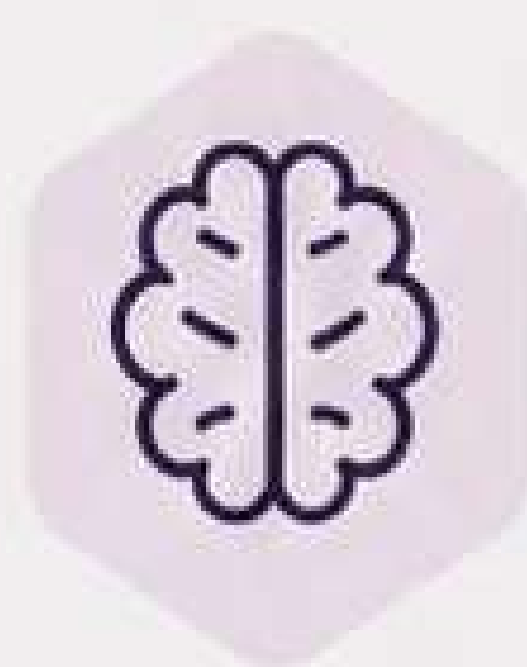
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ACADEMY

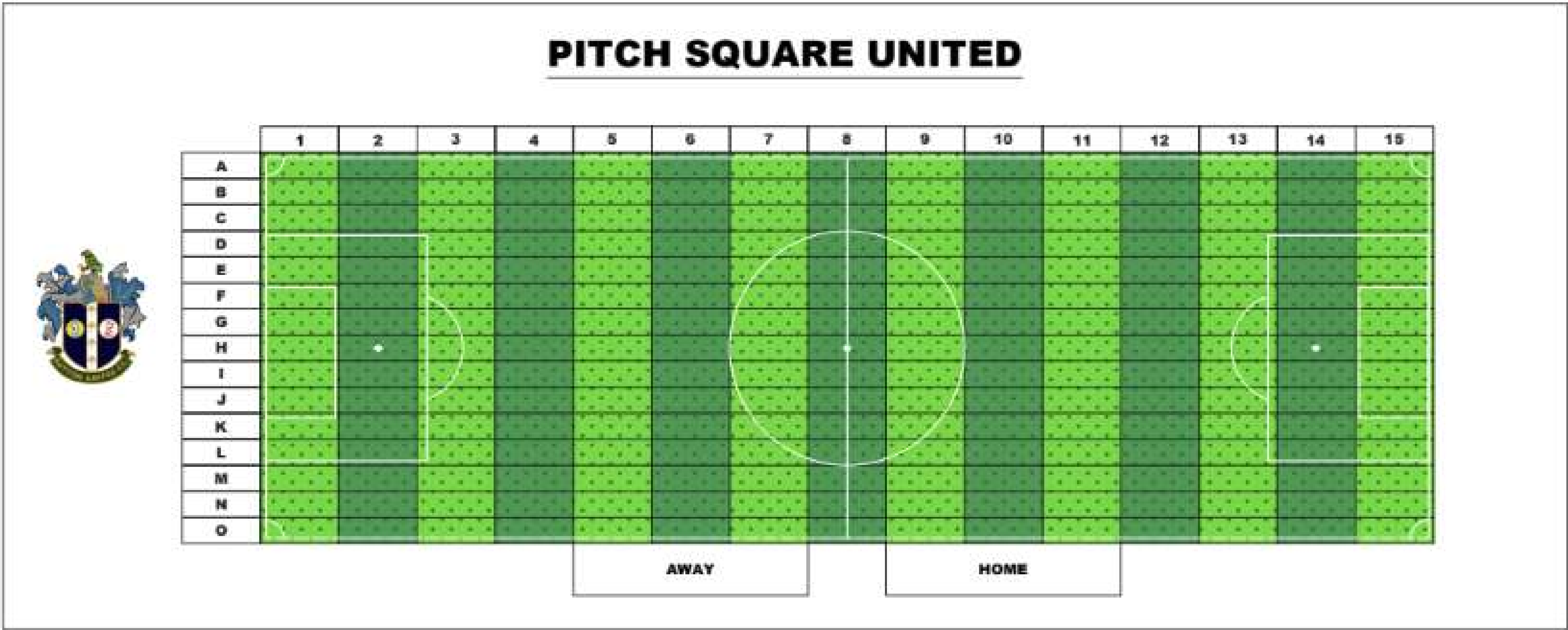

AROUND THE GROUNDS

Louis Massingham Rowell rounds up the latest in the Enterprise National League.

The 2026-27 National League campaign returned with its usual drama and excitement last weekend, with 39 goals scored across the twelve games.

Today's opponents, Altrincham, scored the first goal of the new campaign before eventually losing 3-1 at home to Southend United. Tom Crawford's seventh-minute opener kicked off the new season before Leon Chambers-Parillon, Oli Coker and Harry Cardwell gave the Essex side an opening day win. The victory was a first in the dugout for new Southend manager Kieron Dyer and made it four opening-day fixtures without defeat for the Shrimpers.

It was an opening day to remember for some of the division's new boys. Harrogate Town began their first campaign at the level since 2020 with a 5-2 win over Solihull Moors. Despite coming back from two goals down to level 2-2 in the 81st minute, Solihull succumbed to Harrogate's pressure and left empty-handed. A six-minute brace from substitute Ciaran McGuckin secured the three points for Simon Weaver's side.

Two sides promoted from the National League South, making their debuts in the National League, secured their first wins at the level. Worthing had to ride their luck in the first half at Carlisle and could have been more than one goal down at half-time had Carlisle been more clinical. Some fantastic finishes from Dom Hutchinson, Razzaq Coleman De-Graft and Ricky Aguiar turned the game around in the second half and gave Rob Elliot the worst possible start in his first game as Carlisle manager.

Daryl McMahon's Hornchurch secured a historic victory at home to National League North play-off winners Kidderminster. By the 34th minute, the Urchins were 3-0 up and comfortable thereafter as the Harriers created two attempts on goal, neither on target. Former U's defender Joe Kizzi opened the scoring in the win on his debut for the East London side, having moved from Barnet in the summer.

The Harriers will be looking to get their first win of the season today against Eastleigh. The Hampshire side secured their first win under former Sutton manager Matt Gray last weekend, beating Gateshead 2-1 at the Silverlake Stadium. The opening goal came from two sons of ex-Premier League players, Paul Dickov and Steve Sidwell. Max Dickov crossed for Harry Sidwell to head home in the 13th minute before Josh Lundstram added Eastleigh's second in the second half. Ashley Boatswain scored a consolation in the 91st minute in Lee Cattermole's managerial debut, having joined the Heed in the summer.

Cattermole will be hoping he can get his first win today against a Woking side that are still without a permanent manager after their 3-0 defeat at home to the U's last weekend. Another side looking to put an opening day defeat behind them is Barrow. Having finished bottom of League Two in the last campaign, the Bluebirds were given a tough start, travelling to big spenders Hartlepool United. Two of Pool's debutants, Will Harris and Jack Nolan, gave Lee Clark's side the three points at Victoria Park.

Boston's opener against Aldershot saw twenty players making their debuts. New Shots manager Scott Davies, who signed eighteen players in the summer, secured a 1-0 victory thanks to John Gilbert's goal in the 59th minute. The hosts had Jake Rooney sent off in second-half injury time, and they will look to bounce back today with their trip to Solihull.

Robbie Savage's Forest Green Rovers side scored three second-half goals to see off a spirited performance from Halifax Town. Will Flint gave the Shaymen the lead in the first half, but goals from Filoofe Mabete, Sean Etaluku and Kyle McAllister were enough for Rovers to seal the three points. Halifax's new manager, John McGrath, will be looking to get his first win at home today against a Boreham Wood side who dropped two points late on last weekend.

Having scored 27 goals and finished joint-second top scorer last season, Matt Rush started where he left off, scoring a hat-trick for Luke Garrard's side in a 3-3 draw at home to Tamworth. The Lambs start the season under new American ownership, with money spent on several summer arrivals including Kieren Donnelly, who scored a brace on his debut. The Wood looked set to secure an opening day win until ex-Sutton loanee Danny Cashman, making his Boreham Wood debut, conceded a 100th-minute penalty that allowed the Lambs to leave Hertfordshire with a point.

National League North champions AFC Fylde started the season with a 2-2 draw at home to Wealdstone. The Coasters will be disappointed not to have secured three points having created numerous chances across the 90 minutes. Adam Lewis' goal of the season contender in the 67th minute opened the scoring before the Stones came from behind twice, getting their second equaliser in the 89th minute through Olufela Olomola. The result ended a run of fourteen consecutive wins in the league at Mill Farm for Fylde, dating back to 22nd November

2025 when Buxton took all three points in a 2-1 win.

Another player who scored on his debut was Luke Brennan, whose lovely finish in the 89th minute secured a 1-1 draw for Scunthorpe at home to Yeovil. Brennan joined in the summer from Buxton, having scored 15 goals in the National League North last season. His goal cancelled out Mason Obeng's debut goal for Yeovil. Obeng is also making the step up to the National League this season after signing from Walton & Hersham, having registered 22 goal contributions in 42 appearances for the Swans in the Southern Premier South.
