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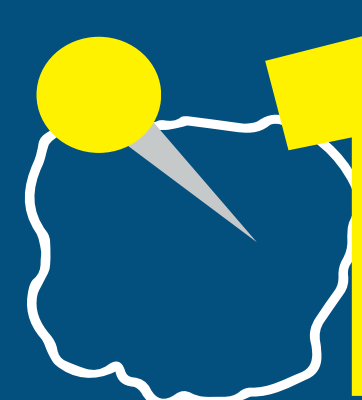

Former Blackburn Rovers midfielder Scott Sellars was appointed Birmingham City's Senior Pathway to Professional and Under-21s Coach in June 2026, following an extensive career in football.

Born in Sheffield, Sellars made over 500 appearances during his playing career, beginning at Leeds United before establishing himself at Blackburn Rovers. He spent six years with the club before returning to Leeds in 1992, later representing Newcastle United and Bolton Wanderers in the Premier League. He also played for Huddersfield Town, AGF Aarhus and Mansfield Town before retiring in 2003.

Sellars subsequently moved into coaching, working at Chesterfield, Sheffield United and Manchester City before joining Wolverhampton Wanderers in 2014. During his time at Wolves, he held several senior academy roles, including Under-21s Head Coach, Head of Player Development, Head of Academy and Technical Director.

At Birmingham, Sellars oversees the Pathway to Professional phase from Under-15 to Under-21 level, with direct responsibility for the Under-21 squad and developing young players into senior football.

The 19-year-old progressed through the academy before earning his first professional contract in 2025. He has gained valuable experience with the Under-21s, testing himself against older and stronger opposition while developing physically and tactically.

Da Silva was also part of Birmingham's PDL title-winning squad, gaining valuable experience of competing across a successful campaign.

Capable of beating defenders and delivering quality balls into the box, Da Silva possesses strong playmaking ability and an eye for creating chances. He started the Under-18s PDL final victory over Charlton Athletic, helping Birmingham secure the title.





Connor Reilly

Forward

Connor Reilly is a promising forward within Birmingham City's academy, having progressed into the club's Under-18 and Under-21 sides. The England youth player joined Birmingham's professional development setup in 2025 and has continued to gain valuable experience across age groups.

Reilly is capable of playing across the forward line and has shown an eye for goal, recording seven goals in 16 appearances for Birmingham U18 during 2025/26. He also stepped up to Under-21 level during the campaign, gaining experience against older opposition.

Finn McGreevy is an exciting young winger who joined Birmingham City in July 2026 after impressing during a successful trial period.

Born in 2008, the England and Republic of Ireland-eligible forward began his senior career with Hampton & Richmond Borough, making his first-team debut during the 2025/26 season before gaining further experience on loan at Egham Town.

A right winger, McGreevy is known for his pace, power and positive approach, with a willingness to take on defenders and attack from wide areas.

He signed a two-year professional contract with Birmingham and joined the Under-21 squad for the 2026/27 campaign. He scored on his competitive debut for the Blues against Boston United.





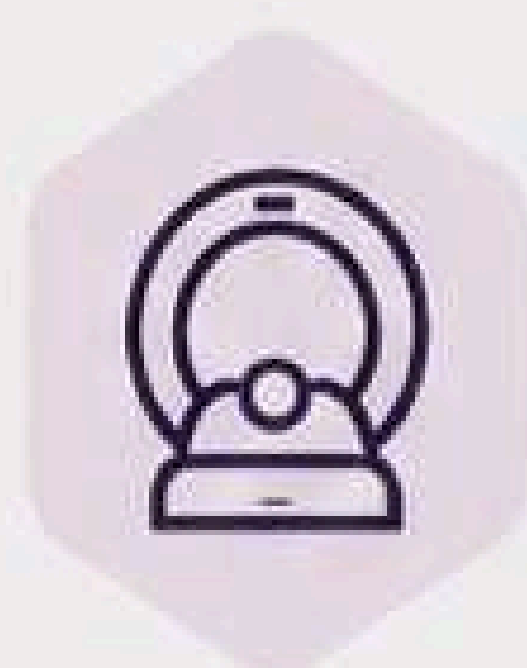
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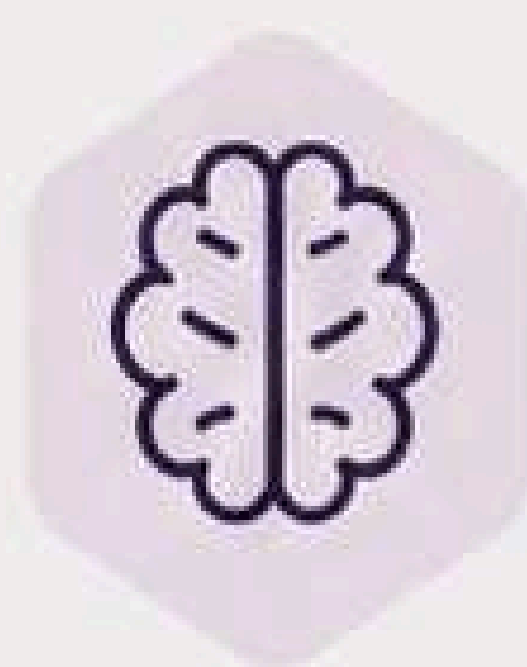
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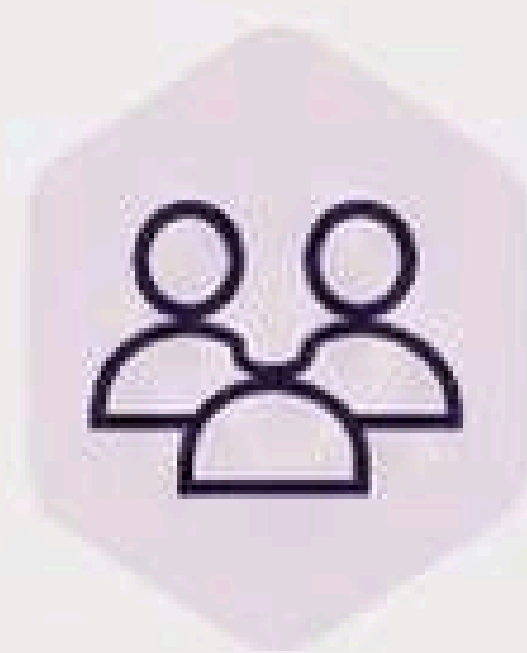
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HISTORIC RAMBLINGS

It would be impossible to cover U's FA Cup history in this month, it would require the publishing of a book, so here I visit U's minor cup matches. Even that list is extensive; 41 in all since senior status in 1910. Below is a summary.

The first was in 1912, a London Senior 2nd qualifying round tie at home to London Polytechnic. Sutton squeezed home by 3-2 with goals from G Baker, A Davis (right) and H Rowe.



Almost two decades later in 1930, U's visited their old South Suburban League rivals Tooting Town at the first stage of the Surrey Charity Shield. It took a late extra-time goal by A Barnes (his only goal for the club) to separate Athenians from their now London League hosts. Two years later and now as Tooting & Mitcham United, Town having amalgamated with Mitcham Wanderers, same competition, same stage and a more comfortable outcome for Sutton, 3-1. Both matches were played on the opponent's ground.

Another two decades before U's had interest in a minor cup competition in September. From 1953 to 1963, U's contested the first round of the South of the Thames Cup, a competition consisting of first round, semi-final and final rounds devised and organised by a couple of Bromley FC committee members. All were played midweek with early kick offs (no floodlights at GGL until 1963). The first opponent was Isthmian League Corinthian-Casuals. U's won this match at GGL by 2-1 (Bill Goddard 2). The following season, a John Staples goal saw off T&M again at the 'Lane (Sutton went on to defeat Bromley in the final) and in 1955, United hosted Wimbledon defeating their IL visitors by 3-0, Staple again and Vic Honey with two goals.

The draw coupled Sutton and T&M together again at GGL in 1956; a 2-2 draw after extra time. U's won the replay at Sandy Lane, three days over seven months later. 1957 brought a fifth successive home draw, another Isthmian visitor in Dulwich Hamlet. The match finished 0-0 and

another seven month wait for the replay followed, this time United lost by 2-0 at Champion Hill.

1958 finally saw the club drawn away with the opponents more Isthmian flavour in Kingstonian. The hosts won by 2-1 and a year later, Wimbledon gained revenge with a 3-1 win at Plough Lane. Wimbledon again in 1960, winning by 2-1 at GGL. A fifth consecutive first round exit followed in '61 at Bromley by 3-1 as Isthmian football continued to have the upper hand over Athenian League Sutton.

With enough football already squeezed into the calendar the decision to have a two-legged first round in 1962 seemed ridiculous (even more ridiculous with the winter that followed). Albert Mendum scored his first goal for Sutton in a 1-1 draw with T&M at GGL; U's won the second leg by 3-0 just under a month later. The semi-final was not played until September of 1963, U's thrashed at Wimbledon by 5-0 (Sutton went back to Plough Lane in March in the Isthmian League and defeated the champions elect, 5-0!).

Featured Match

**10th September 1968 v Walton & Hersham South of
Thames Cup, first round**



This appeared to be a tough assignment for Sutton as the visitors had won all seven of their Athenian League Premier Division matches scoring 31 and conceding just two. U's early form had been unconvincing; three wins, three losses but this would be a third consecutive victory without conceding.

Having defeated Bromley the previous May in the final, holders Sutton were not ready to lose their grip on this minor cup and W&H including former U's defender Dave Worby and future Sutton players, 'keeper Gary Bloom and centre-forward David Gale. They proved no match for the hosts though as while they defended well in the first half, they offered little in an attacking sense. Trevor Bladon was the architect of Sutton's success. He netted the opening goal with a curling shot off the post in the 37th minute. In the second half he ran the show.

Bladon constantly ran and weaved past industrial level challenges. In the 56th minute, another run ended with a 25 yard shot being pushed away by Bloom. Bladon delivered the resulting corner and Dave Hutchins got his foot to the ball to net. Thirteen minutes from time, Worby (already booked) again brought Bladon down. Hutchins took the free-kick which the Walton defence failed to deal with to allow Alan Gane (in for the absent Larry Pritchard on FA duty in Guernsey) to score his first Sutton goal.

The semi-final would not be played until May 1970, U's losing to T&M in what was the club's final SotTC tie.

The 1968/9 season brought two other non-FA Cup ties, both in the London Challenge Cup which pitted the cream of London's amateur and semi-professional clubs against Football League sides. A week after the above W&H match, U's travelled to Southern League Wimbledon and Sutton's amateurs outplayed their semi-pro hosts to win by a Bladon goal. Thirteen nights later, U's topped that with a 1-0 defeat of Brentford at Griffin Park, Pritchard on target.

A year later, another two London Challenge ties saw Sutton defeat Leytonstone by 3-0 and then Fulham by 5-0 both at GGL; Bladon netted a hat-trick in the latter against future United 'keeper

Alan Thomas. Earlier in the month, Sutton had defeated Erith & Belvedere in the London Charity Cup 1st round by 2-0 (Bladon 2) at home.

The 1970/71 season saw U's play one minor cup tie again in the London Challenge Cup. It would prove to be their last in this much coveted competition as they disappointingly lost 2-1 at home to Hitchin Town.

Four years on and an early London Senior first round tie saw Sutton squeeze past Spartan League hosts Harefield United by 2-1 (Tony Coppin, Graham Dennis penalty).

September in the first part of the 1980s brought Isthmian League Cup second rounds. Three weeks after losing 5-1 at home to Dulwich Hamlet in the league, U's travelled to Champion Hill in September '80 and recorded a fine 3-1 victory, Micky's Joyce and Stephens and Keith Jones, his only senior goal for the club, scoring. In 1981, a 0-0 draw with Leatherhead at GGL, the replay played in October going Sutton's way. Worthing provided the second round opposition in both the following seasons; U's triumphed 2-1 in the first at Woodside Road and 4-0 at GGL in the second.

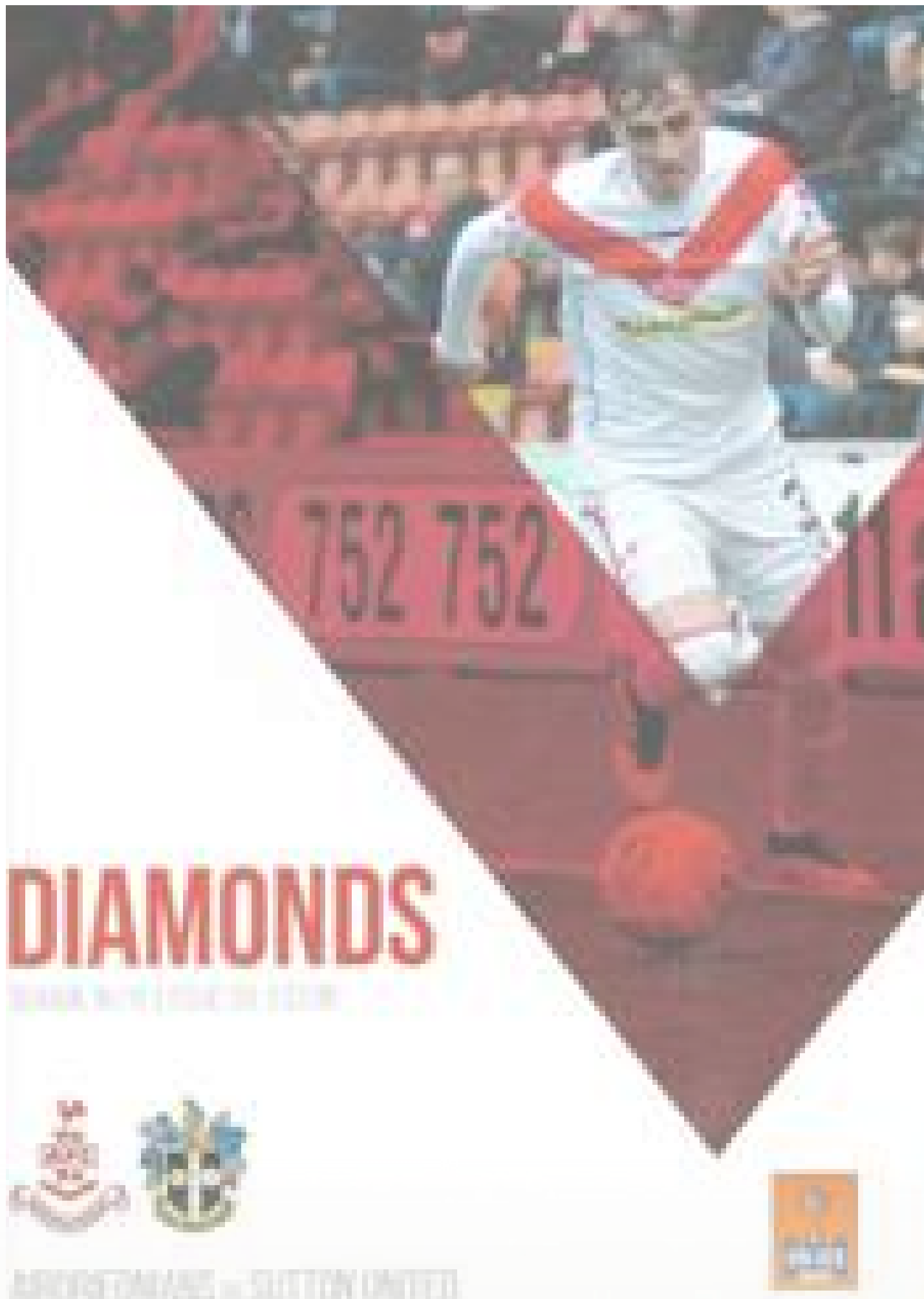
After five seasons in the GMV Conference, U's renewed relations with non-FA Cup cup ties in September in 1991. Once again, they were ILC first round ties. Stevenage Borough were just starting to begin the long climb up The Pyramid and they were beaten, narrowly 2-1 at GGL, Andy Barnes with both goals in his last appearance for us before joining Crystal Palace. The following season Hitchin Town were defeated by 2-0 again at Sutton and in 1993 a similar score line was enough to defeat another side coming out of comparative obscurity, Purfleet.

In 1994 U's were fortunate to draw at home with Canvey Island before winning the replay by 4-2, a year later Tring Town were defeated by 2-0 at GGL before another trip to the Island in 1996 brought a 2-1 success. Bracknell Town hosted the 1997 tie, Sutton winning a poor encounter by 2-0 (Jimmy Dack and Dominic Feltham) and the following season, U's won at Dulwich by 3-2 aided by an absolute howler by former U's 'keeper Les Cleevely.

Sutton's final ILC tie in the month of September was in 2000. Freshly relegated after one difficult GMV Conference season, U's were humiliated by Corinthian-Casuals at their Tolworth home by 1-0, Ryan Palmer red carded.

The next September minor cup tie was in 2018, if the Irn Bru Cup could be classed as minor. The draw pitted Sutton with Airdrie and thus the club's first ever match in Scotland.

A tense afternoon was settled by Tommy Wright to set up what would be an unforgettable trip to Dublin.



More recently, in 2022, Sutton lost 3-1 at Leyton Orient in the EFL (Papa Johns) Trophy; Craig Eastmond sent off in that and in 2023 Sutton lost in the now Bristol Street Motors Trophy on penalties to Aston Villa's Under-21 squad after a 2-2 draw; also that September, the club exited the EFL (Carabao) Cup, 2-1 at Port Vale in the third round.

Last season, U's poor start to the National League Cup and the season in general continued with a 2-1 home reverse to Brighton & Hove Albion.

SUFC v Birmingham City

City's only visit to GGL was just a couple of years ago in the FA Cup first round. The Blues were going great guns in the EFL League One but National League Sutton put in a decent performance to lose to a solitary Willum Willumsson goal. Jayden Harris had missed a glorious chance for Sutton at 0-0 when clean through while late on Ashley Nadesan had a great chance to force extra time and maybe penalties, this being the first season without replays in the competition proper.

We came from two goals down with ten minutes to go to grab a point in Wednesday's opening National League Academy South game at Tooting & Mitcham.

Dorking took an early lead when a left wing free kick was volleyed in from beyond the far post by Georgie Helder, and only a good save by goalkeeper Oli Ko with his legs prevented Leo Bines doubling the lead.

We finished the half strongly with Tae Bamidele's shot blocked and Haniel Boateng (below) denied by Dorking goalkeeper Nathaniel Golan, but despite continuing brightly after the break we fell further behind on the hour when a free kick from the right glanced in off substitute Jack Pledge for an own goal.



Pledge shot over and Josh Jenkins sent an effort just wide of the far post as we looked for a way back, and with seven minutes to go the increasing pressure told when Omotolani Bello scrambled the ball in following a succession of corners.

There was then a long stoppage for an injury to Helder, who had to be stretchered off, and in the fifth of the fifteen additional minutes that were played Bello's corner found the net off Dorking defender Finley McIntyre to tie the scores.
